The temple tower serves as a delightful reminder of the connection between Madurai's spiritual heritage, symbolized by the Meenakshi Amman temple's gopuram, and Thiagarajar College's commitment to education as a "Temple of Learning."

The book and the veena, represents the luminous Goddess Saraswathi in a glowing white form encapsulates the essence of knowledge and the pinnacle of individual accomplishments. The fish, of course, harks back to history, to the continued legacy of the Pandyas. The lotus, a cherished symbol in Indian culture, unfolds its petals to reveal the blossoming of the consciousness, the soul, and the mind. The elephant is a symbol of prosperity of mind and body, the pond being the nurturing ecosystem of all that is good and pure, and symbolises unconditional love.

## **History of the College**

Thiagarajar College, founded on 7<sup>th</sup> July 1949, was formally inaugurated on 12<sup>th</sup> October 1949 by His Excellency, the King of Bhavnagar, the then Governor of the Madras State.

Since its inception, Thiagarajar College has consistently held a leading position among higher education institutions in Tamil Nadu. The college which started with only three undergraduate courses, has significantly expanded its academic offerings to now include 29 undergraduate programs, 14 postgraduate programs, and 10 Ph.D. programs, as well as 13 diploma and 16 certificate courses. The Departments of Tamil, English, Economics, Commerce, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology and National Centre of Excellence have been recognized as Research Centres by Madurai Kamaraj University.

The institution achieved autonomous status in 1987 and received its first accreditation from NAAC with Five Stars in 2001. It has maintained its high standards with 'A' Grade re-accreditations in 2007 and 2013. Most recently, in 2021, the institution was awarded an A++ Grade in the fourth cycle with a CGPA of 3.63, further solidifying its reputation for excellence. Recognized by NAAC as a high-performing institution, our college has received an extended accreditation validity of 7 years. The college has also demonstrated consistent improvement in the NIRF rankings, climbing from 44<sup>th</sup> in 2018 to its current highest position of 15<sup>th</sup> in 2024.

# **Important Information for Students**

## I. Rules for the conduct of students

- All students are required to wear their official college identity cards at all times while on campus. Failure to present a valid identity card upon request may result in denied entry to college premises and/or disciplinary action.
- 2) Clothing/Attire should be neat, clean and appropriate for an academic environment
- 3) Girl students should wear saree/chudidhar/salwar kameez with duppatta.
- 4) Girls and boys should not wear collarless or sleeveless T- shirts and half pants. Boys should button up their shirts and they should not wear earrings.

- 5) Sports attire is permitted exclusively for students participating in athletic activities on the designated playing fields.
- 6) All students are required to enter and exit the college premises through the designated entrance gate. Scaling or jumping over the compound wall is strictly prohibited and will result in disciplinary action.
- 7) All students are required to participate in the singing of the prayer song and the recitation of the oath, during the first hour of each working day.
- 8) Punctuality is mandatory for all classes. Students are expected to maintain a quiet and respectful atmosphere within the classroom. The library, Nonresidential student centre, and hostel are accessible exclusively during designated breaks or when no classes are scheduled.
- 9) Students should not indulge in unnecessary activities such as picking up a fight, indulging in quarrel, eve teasing and ragging. Engaging in any of these activities may lead to disciplinary consequences, ranging from suspension to permanent expulsion from the college.
- 10) All students are responsible for maintaining the cleanliness and orderliness of the college campus.
- 11) Smoking/Drinking is strictly prohibited in the college campus.
- 12) Exiting the classroom during teaching hours is permitted only with the permission of the teacher.
- 13) Students should maintain decorum while moving to the next class.

- 14) Damaging or defacing college property by way of writing, drawing or scribbling on walls, benches, or any other items on campus is strictly prohibited.
- 15) Students are expected to read the notices displayed on the notice boards every day. Failure to do so may result in missed information or opportunities, and the college will not be held responsible for any consequences arising from not reading the notices.
- 16) Distribution of circulars across departments or posting them on notice boards requires prior approval from the Principal.
- 17) Students should participate in extra-curricular activities for developing their innate talents.
- 18) Students should not become a member of any organization unaffiliated to the institution. Students should refrain from activities that would bring disrepute to the individual and to the institution.
- 19) Students who violate the college rules will be summarily expelled from the college after enquiry. Based on the established government rules, the Principal has the right to reinforce the following punishments to levy fine, to remove the name from the college roll and attendance, to stop the issue of certificates, to stop the entry of the students into the college and expel them from the college.

## II. Regarding attendance and leave

- Students are expected to be punctual to college every day.
- 2) Students must obtain prior approval/permission from either the Principal or the Head of the Department before applying for leave.
- 3) Students applying for leave, should duly fill-up the leave form and sent to through the Head of the department to the Principal. Grant or denial of leave rests with the principal.
- 4) Hostel students should apply for leave through the wardens and the Heads of the department.
- 6) The leave form should clearly state the reason and contain information regarding the same for the requested leave.
- 7) Students applying for sick leave should submit a valid medical certificate. Submission of the medical certificate will be taken into account only for condoning the fine and not for claiming attendance.
- 8) Students applying for leave should submit the form before 1.35 p.m. the previous day.
- 9) The Principal reserves the right to request a medical certificate and make decisions regarding leave or attendance based on the information provided in the certificate.
- 10) Student's leave application without satisfactory explanation will be automatically rejected.
- 11) Breach of rules will either lead to a fine or may even lead to the removal of students' name from the college roll.

- 12) Students who are absent for 10 consecutive days without submitting a proper leave form will be removed from the college roll. Each day consists of two sessions: a three-hour morning session and a two-hour afternoon session. Attendance will be recorded during each class hour.
- 13) Students will be marked absent if they fail to be present when attendance is being marked during each class hour. Students will miss half-a-day's attendance even if they are absent for one hour.
- 14) Students who do not submit leave form and absent themselves will be fined at the rate of 1 Rupee for half-a-day and 2 Rupees for full day.
- 15) If the Principal is not satisfied with the behaviour of the students or if their attendance falls below the required percentage for a semester, they will be denied attendance certificate.
- 16) Students are required to maintain a minimum attendance of 75% to be eligible for semester examinations. Failure to meet this requirement will result in the withholding of their hall ticket.
- 17) Attendance requirements are strictly enforced. No exemptions or condonations will be granted for insufficient attendance.
- 18) Students who fail to meet the attendance requirements for their undergraduate or postgraduate courses must re-register for the semester, attend all classes, fulfil the internal assessment requirements, and then appear for the semester examination.

# Withdrawal procedures from the college / Rules and regulations for discontinuing the course

- Students who want to discontinue the programme, during the academic year have to pay the required fee and other charges till date of requesting the same. They have to clear all the pending dues.
- 2) Students who withdraw from their study programme during the academic year will not be eligible for any refund of fees or charges.
- 3) Graduating students are required to obtain nodues clearance from all departments before leaving the college.
- 4) Course completion certificates will be awarded in accordance with university rules and regulations, based on students' academic performance and conduct deemed satisfactory by the Principal.

If there is any mistake, students should inform the college office through the Head of the department for corrections. Corrected applications will be then sent to the Office of the Controller of Examinations.
- 4) Examination fees should be paid within the stipulated time in the bank.
- 5) Details of payment of examination fee should be filled and the challan be attached with the application. The Head of the department should sign the same and sent to the Office of the Controller of Examinations,
- 6) Students should make sure that they encircle the correct code and the title of the paper for which they appear for the examination.
- 7) Late application will not be accepted.
